Must hold either a blue or bronze seal only and be under 26 years on 1st May in the current year and have shorn in the UK only.

The Worshipful Company of Woolmen has also offered the following prizes to these two competitors – £50, a medal and a £50 BWMB voucher for further shearing training to the highest placed eligible shearer. £25, a medal and a £25 BWMB voucher for further shearing training to the 2nd highest place eligible shearer.

As a means of encouragement to junior and intermediate shearers Lister Shearing Equipment Ltd has offered prizes for each of the finalists in the junior and intermediate. All finalists in these championships will receive a special trophy and a championship Lister shearing vest.

The competition will be a straight run-through team effort and will comprise of two open standard shearers each from England, France, Northern Ireland, Republic of Ireland, Scotland and Wales.

The team from Northern Ireland will be the top 2 open shearers from the Royal Ulster Competition for Machine Shearing, top 2 competitors for the Blade Shearing and the Wool Handling from Balmoral Show 2022.

Machine Shearing held at Balmoral Show – 11th – 14th May 2022 Blade Shearing held at Bath & West Show – 2nd – 4th June 2022 Wool Handling held at Royal Welsh - 18th – 21st July 2022

THE GOLDEN SHEARERS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Golden Shearers World Championships will take place at the Royal Highland Show in 2023.

The team for the Golden Shearers World Championship will be selected from the 2022 results and will consist of the winner of the RUAS International Competition who will be the captain and the highest placed winner of the NISSA Open Circuit – If this is the same person the selection will move to second place competitor in the NISSA Open Circuit.

The team for the Blades and Wool Handling competition will be selected from the National Competition at Balmoral Show 2022.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

All sheep shearing competitions will be held under the World rules (published in the spring 2022 edition of Newsclip). Additional RUAS rules as listed are also included:-

- 1. Time points calculation one penalty for 40 seconds for juniors and young farmers.
- 2. Competitors who either cut teat, pizzle or wound scoring 20 or more penalties, even though they have been placed, may not be eligible for any prizes in cash or kind.
- 3. Competitors entering the competition on the day will not be refunded their entry into the showgrounds.
- 4. Grinders will not be available for sharpening and no grinders are allowed to be brought in. Anyone caught in possession of a grinder will be automatically disqualified.

In the interest of safety the use of worm drives is compulsory.

All competitors are also bound by the general regulations and instructions for the Society's Annual Show as contained in the main prize schedule - copies available online. Subject to any right of appeal contained in the Society's regulations and instructions to exhibitors, the chief steward's ruling shall be final on any matter not covered by British Isles Shearing Competition Association rules committee.

All shearers/wool handlers may be required to complete a declaration on the day confirming that they cleaned and disinfected their protective clothing and equipment before coming onto the Show premises. Any shearer/wool handler unable to complete such a declaration will not be permitted to compete and the RUAS reserve the right to inspect the clothing and equipment of all shearing/wool handling competitors.

Shearers should note that NO commercial symbols may be worn by competitors unless they have been provided by the sponsors for the competitions or approved by a chief steward.

Competitors should note that prize money will not be paid on the day. Shearers/wool handlers must provide an address for prize cheques to be forwarded after the Show.
