



BALMORAL SHOW 2021 CONDITIONS OF ENTRY FOR ALL

In order to gain access to the 2021 Balmoral Show in September **ALL** ticket and wristband holders (**Including children 11 and over**) will need to demonstrate their COVID-19 status on entry by providing **ONE** of the following:-

- Proof of full vaccination – both doses received (with the second at least 14 days prior to your arrival at the Show) however it is recommended that you also take a lateral flow test before attending the Show and a few days after. It is noted also that 16/17year old may only have one vaccination.
- OR Proof of a negative NHS Lateral Flow Test taken no more than 48 hours prior to your arrival at the Show
- OR Proof of natural COVID antibodies based upon a positive NHS PCR test within 180 days of the event you are attending (including 10 days self-isolation following the result)

Ticket and Wristband Holders from Northern Ireland

If you are resident in Northern Ireland you can demonstrate your COVID-19 status by doing any **ONE** of the following:-

- Demonstrate proof of full vaccination by showing your COVID-19 Vaccination Card that was issued to you when you received your vaccination, at the entry gate. You must also show valid government issued Photographic ID matching the name on your vaccination card.

In the event you had cause to use the COVIDCert NI Passport App to obtain proof of full vaccination for travel purposes this proof is also acceptable to use for entry.

Other government issued proofs of full vaccination are also acceptable, provided you also produce valid government issued Photo ID.

NB: your proof of vaccination must reflect that you have had both doses of the NHS COVID-19 vaccine, and that your second dose was administered at least 14 days prior to the event you are attending.

- If you cannot demonstrate that you have received both doses of an NHS COVID 19 vaccination, you will need to take an NHS Lateral Flow Test taken no more than 48 hours prior to your arrival at the Show. Assuming the results is negative, you must then report the results online <https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests> and present your NHS email or text notification of your result at the entry gates.
- Alternatively, you can also gain entry by demonstrating Proof of natural COVID antibodies based upon a positive NHS PCR test within 180 days of the event you are attending (including

10 days self-isolation following the result) You must present this proof at the entry gates to gain admittance.

Ticket Holders from the Republic of Ireland

If you live in the Republic of Ireland you can demonstrate your COVID-19 status using the EU Digital COVID certification (DCC).

Ticket holders from England

If you are resident in England, you can show your status easily via the NHS COVID pass on the NHS APP. For more information visit <https://www.gov.uk/guidance/nhs-covid-pass>

We recommend that you screenshot or download a copy of your NHS COVID Pass to your smartphone prior to arrival so that you have it ready to show at the entry gates. Alternatively you can print a copy and bring this with you.

If you do not have access to a smartphone or computer then you can call 119 to request a letter to demonstrate your vaccination status or [online here](#). Please note that the letter can take up to 5 working days to reach you. This letter will be sent to the address registered with your GP.

If you cannot access your NHS COVID Pass or if you do not receive a vaccination status letter in time you will need to provide evidence of a negative Lateral Flow Test, by reporting the [result here](#) and presenting your NHS email or text notification at the entry gate. The test must be taken no more than 48 hours before your arrival at the Show.

Alternatively, you can also gain entry by demonstrating Proof of natural COVID antibodies based upon a positive NHS PCR test within 180 days of the Show (including 10 days self-isolation following the result).

Ticket holders for Scotland

If you live in Scotland, you can obtain your full vaccination status [here](#).

If you do not receive the letter in time you will need to provide evidence of a negative NHS Lateral Flow Test by reporting the [result here](#) and presenting your NHS email or text notification at the entry gate. The test must be taken no more than 48 hours before you arrive at the Show.

Alternatively, you can also gain entry by demonstrating. Proof of natural COVID antibodies based upon a positive NHS PCR test within 180 days of the Show (including 10 days self-isolation following the result).

Ticket holders from Wales

If you live in Wales you can obtain your full vaccination status by following the instructions <https://gov.wales/get-nhs-covid-pass-show-your-vaccination-status-travel>

If you cannot access your NHS COVID Pass you will need to provide evidence of a negative NHS lateral Flow test by reporting the result [here](#) and presenting your NHS email or text notification at the entry gate. The test must be taken no more than 48 hours before your arrival at the Show.

Alternatively, you can also gain entry by demonstrating Proof of natural COVID antibodies based upon a positive NHS PCR test within 180 days of the Show (including 10 days self-isolation following the result).

Other ticket holders (International)

All other ticket holders not attending from any of the countries listed above will be required to provide evidence of a negative NHS Lateral Flow Test by presenting your NHS email or test notification at the entry gate. The test must be taken no more than 48 hours before your arrival at the Show.

How to upload your NHS lateral Flow Test

If you are demonstrating your COVID-19 status using an NHS lateral flow test this should be taken no more than 48 hours prior to your arrival at the Show. You can order NHS Lateral Flow tests [here](#).

Once you have taken your test you will need to report your result on the NHS website [here](#). You will receive a text or email notification confirming your negative test result to present on entry.

A positive result from an NHS Lateral Flow Test means it is likely you had coronavirus when the test was done. You and anyone you live with must not attend the Show and self-isolate immediately. You are then advised to get a PCR test to confirm your results as soon as possible.
